The Odonata of North America, including Mexico, Central America and the West Indies

Abstract

A list of the Odonata of North America, including all of its tropical regions south through Panama and the West Indies, is presented here. Common names in English are included for all of the species.

Resumen

Una lista de los odonatos de Norteamérica, incluyendo todos sus regiones tropicales al sur a través de Panamá y las Indias Occidentales, se presenta aquí. Nombres comunes en inglés para todas las especies están incluido.

Introduction

Over the past few decades I have been working on coining English common names for all the odonate species of Mexico, Central America and the West Indies that did not already have them. This project came to its final stages recently because I have been leading odonate-oriented nature tours to Costa Rica and Panama, with most people on the tours more interested in learning common than scientific names.

The names, some changed on the spot because of feedback from tour participants, have evolved considerably over that period, but I finally felt the need to make the list official so it could be used in publications, for conservation issues, on people's blogs and photo sites, etc. As did Sid Dunkle and I for the US and Canadian species, I have made every effort to give species descriptive names, which should make them easiest to learn. A combination of descriptive and memorable was always in our minds.

However, there are so many tropical species that look about the same but differ in minor aspects of genitalic structure that it was impossible always to use that protocol. So names based on geography or habitat were added to that mix, as was the occasional patronym. Many of our well-known odonatologists had already been honored by a common name for a species occurring in the US or Canada. Some names came from direct translation of scientific names.

After a long incubation period, I submitted the list of proposed names to the other members of the DSA Checklist Committee, some of whom made valuable suggestions for changes, and as a group we arrived at a final list. This is that list, to be considered a publication of the committee and hopefully an official list to be used by all who use common

names for any purpose. It can also be used as a checklist of all of the Odonata species of this region.

We hope also that this list offers a stimulus for our colleagues south of the border to come up with common names in Spanish to promote amateur interest in Odonata in their countries.

Introducción

En las últimas décadas, he estado trabajando de acuñar nombres comunes para todas las especies de Odonata de México, Centroamérica, y las Antillas que aún no los tenían. Este proyecto llegó a las etapas finales recientemente porque he estado guiando giras de naturaleza enfoque en Odonata en Costa Rica y Panamá, y la mayoría de las personas en las giras tienen más interés de aprender nombres comunes que nombres científicas.

Los nombres, algunos cambiaron en el acto a debido de reacciones de participantes en la gira, han desarrollado considerablemente durante este periodo, pero finalmente sentí la necesidad de hacer que la lista sea oficial, para que pueda ser usado en publicaciones, para cuestiones de conservación, en blogs y sitios del red con fotos, etcetera. De la misma manera que Sid Dunkle y yo hicimos para las especies de los Estados Unidos de América y Canadá, hice todo lo posible dar nombres descriptivos a las especies, lo que debería hacerlos más fácil de aprender. Una combinación de descriptivo y memorable siempre fue en nuestras mentes.

Sin embargo, hay tan mucho especies que parecen más o menos la misma pero son diferentes en aspectos menores de la estructura de los genitales que fue imposible siempre usar este protocolo. Así, nombres basado en geografía o habitat fueron agregados a esa mezcla, como era el patronímico oca-

sional. Muchos de nuestros colegas ya habían sido honrados con un nombre común para una especie que ocurre en los Estados Unidos de América o Canadá. Algunos fueron una traducción directa de nombres científicas.

Después de un periodo largo de incubación, me rendí la lista de nombres proponados a otros miembros del comité de la lista de verificación de la sociedad de libélulas de las Américas, algunos de los cuales hicieron sugerencias valiosas para cambios, y llegamos a una lista final como un grupo. Esta es

esa lista, para ser considerado una publicación del comité y esperanzadamente una lista oficial para ser utilizado de todos que usan nombres comunes para cualquier propósito. Puede ser usado también como una lista de verificación para todas las especies de Odonata de este region.

También esperamos que esta lista ofrece un estímulo para nuestros colegas al sur de la frontera de desarrollar nombres comunes en español para promover interés aficionado en Odonata en sus países.
